Let's face it: Southern California loves its plastic surgery. As a cosmetic surgeon with his own La Jolla practice, Dr. Michael Brucker (drbrucker.com) is already a busy guy. Still, he'll put in a little extra time for his favorite charity, whether he's sporting scrubs or a tux. "I don't work on the weekends unless it's for Fresh Start," says Brucker. In fact, as a volunteer for 11 of the 23 years that Fresh Start Surgical Gifts (freshstart.org) has

been operating, Brucker has racked up more than 400 volunteer hours in the operating room, helping countless children with physical deformities through life-altering surgeries, doing everything from treating cleft palates to ear reconstructions.

Now one of the organization's most senior members and its medical program director, Brucker has helped grow the Carlsbad-based charity into a nationally recognized institution with two must-attend events (October's Butterfly Ball and Charity Golf Tournament) and its own clinic at Rady Children's Hospital. When home in Carmel Valley, the self-described "retro nerd" loves to build custom turntables in his woodshop, but gets really excited when discussing the process of surgically building a new smile for a child.
